Some of his notable inventions include the first wearable insulin pump for diabetics, the HomeChoice™ portable peritoneal dialysis machine, the INDEPENDENCE® IBOT® Mobility System, and the Segway® Human Transporter.**

**At Commencement Mr. Kamen will have bestowed upon him Molloy College's Doctor of Science (Sc.D.) degree. This honorary degree is presented to individuals who have made distinguished contributions and performed services in the sciences.**

**In addition, Barbara Ellen Black, a graduate of the College, will be receiving Molloy's Doctor of Laws (LL.D.) degree. This is the highest honorary degree the College presents to an individual distinguished in general service to the state, to learning and to mankind. Dr. Black has spent much of her career in academia, having worked in the business, finance and administration areas of the following colleges and universities: Fordham University, Hunter College, Dowling College, Georgian Court University, and our very own Molloy College. Dr. Black is currently the Executive Director of the Lower Hudson Valley Catholic College and University Consortium.**
